

Natural Vegetation in Africa


A map of the Great African Rift Valley

African Society

Based on Descent or Lineage

- *Patrilineal* – the father's side of the family is defined as kin
- *Matrilineal* – the mother's side of the family is defined as kin
- *Bilateral* – the system used in most industrial societies (e.g. U.S.), children's kinship is tied to both sides of the family and both male and female children are entitled to inherit.

Chapter 8 – Early Civilizations in Africa

Matriarchy/Patriarchy

- **Matriarchy:** a form of social organization in which the mother is head of the family, and in which descent is reckoned in the female line, the children belonging to the mother's clan; matriarchal system
- **Patriarchy:** a form of social organization in which the father is the supreme authority in the family, clan, or tribe and descent is reckoned in the male line, with the children belonging to the father's clan or tribe.

Chapter 8 – Early Civilizations in Africa

Matrilineal Descent

- Matrilineal descent group comprised of a woman, her siblings, her own children, her sisters' children, and her daughters' children
- Make up about 15% of unilineal descent groups in contemporary societies
- Different from matriarchy (mythological)
- Men retain power and authority but inherit it through the women
- Example = Zuni of New Mexico



Who is a Jew?


- ★ Traditionally, a Jew is anyone who's mother is a Jew
- ★ You can also be a Jew by conversion
- ★ A conversion ceremony is really just an “adoption” into the family of Abraham and Sarah
- ★ The Ancient Israelites' was passed on by the mother instead of the father because you are always sure who the mother is
